## What Happens When All Can Worship?

Several times a month a team from Friendship Community travels to churches in south central Pennsylvania to offer an answer to the question, "What happens when all can worship?"

The participants of the Friendship Community Worship Team are individuals with developmental disabilities served in residential settings operated by Friendship Community.

The team consists of a choir and a creative movement team who through their worship share the message that all people have the desire as well as the capacity to offer worship to God.

The response that the team receives from churches is often overwhelming. It is not unusual for the congregation to offer a standing ovation. At most services, there are tears on the faces of the congregation as the message of God's inclusive nature sinks in.

It is not so much about the pleasing melodies or the graceful movements of the team; in fact, those might not



be the best descriptive terms to use to describe the team. Rather it is about the spirit of worship and the joy in being able to publicly offer praise to God and to be included and recognized as a vessel of praise.

The team from Friendship cannot easily travel across the country to share their message; however, others with a disability in your church may be able to share their talent and their praise that will lead your congregation into a new understanding of the presence of God.

What happens when all can worship? Why not try it?

## Good Stewardship Wounded Warrior

A January 2016 New York Times article indicated that in 2014 WW (Wounded Warrior) spent 40% of its income on overhead. (Semper Fi Fund in contrast spends 8% of income on overhead.)

The Executive Director received \$473,000 in compensation in 2014.

The original founder, Marine veteran, John Melia, resigned in 2009 saying he felt the organization was "stolen from him."

WW spent \$34 million on fundraising in 2014.

Charity Watch has never rated WW higher than "C" rating. There has been multiple firings of employees who raised questions.

Do you have a problem with occasionally committing murder? Do you regularly steal from the store? Silly questions you say. Well, do you have a problem with gossip, idle talk, lying, or spreading rumors?

The Apostle Paul coined the term "busybody" in 1 Timothy 5:3, "They get in the habit of being idle and going from house to house and not only do they become idlers, but also gossips and busybodies saying things they ought not too."

Leviticus 19:16, "Do not spread slanderous gossip among the people." Psalm 41:6, "They visit me as if they were my friends but all the while they gather gossip and when they leave, they spread it everywhere."

Proverbs 16:38, "A trouble maker plants seeds of strife. Gossip separates the best of friends."

Romans 1:29, "Their lives are full of every kind of wickedness, sin, greed, hate, envy, murder, quarreling, deception, malicious behavior and gossip."

## One Nation Under God

I never tire of reading about the founding of our great nation. Yet the outcome of the Constitutional Convention was never a sure thing. The delegates were embroiled in bitter controversy. It was then during one of these furious debates that Benjamin Franklin rose and made the following plea to the delegates:

*"In the beginning of the Contest with Great Britain, when we were sensible of danger, we had daily prayer in this room for the Divine protection."*

Then addressing the entire convention Franklin continued:

*"I have lived, Sir, a long time and the longer I live the more convincing proofs I see of this truth - that God governs in the affairs of men. And if a sparrow cannot fall to the ground without His notice, is it probable that an empire can rise without his aid?"*

*"We have been assured, Sir, in the Sacred Writings, that 'except the Lord build the House, they labor in vain that build it.' I firmly believe this; and I also believe that without His concurring aid we shall succeed in this political building no better than the builders of Babel. We shall be divided by our partial local interests; our projects will be confounded, and we ourselves shall become a reproach and bye word down to future ages ... 'I therefore beg leave to move - that henceforth prayers imploring the assistance of Heaven, and its blessing on our deliberations, be held in this Assembly every morning before we proceed to business, and that one or more of the clergy of this city be requested to officiate in that service.'"*

Would that we and our governing officials turn to prayer and call upon the name of the Lord in these troubling times. We can do no better.

## About Communion

Communion is one of two sacraments in the Lutheran Church. What is a sacrament? A sacrament is commanded by Christ, is connected to earthly elements (bread, grapes, water) and has the promise of forgiveness.

The Lord's Supper (Holy Communion) is for sinners in need of forgiveness and we should receive communion any time it is offered. God invites you by His grace to come to His table.

Martin Luther wrote that "all who care to commune come precisely because they are unfit and unworthy."

In communion God nourishes faith, forgives sin, and calls us to be witnesses to the Gospel.

In communion, the Lord Jesus Christ is present in the bread and wine, but the "how" remains a mystery.

Holy Communion goes under a variety of names: The Lord's Supper, The Last Supper, Eucharist, Sacrament of the Altar, and Mass.

Zion practices "open" communion - all people who believe that Jesus is God's Son are welcome to come to the altar rail.
